The entire community was shocked Thursday evening when it learned that Mrs. Earl Lover-ing, a former resident, had pass-ed away. Orphie Johnson Lovering was born at Adams, Sept, 7, 1902. She was baptized by the Rev. Wm. Rasmussen and after re-ceiving 'religious instruction in the Little Cedar Lutheran Church, she was confirmed by Rev. C. B. Runsvold at the age of fourteen years. She was graduated from the Adams High School with the class of 1920, and continued her studies at St Olaf College, Northfield, where in. 1924 she received her Degree in Home Economics.

Following her graduation she was for two years a member of the High School faculty at East Chain, Minn., after which she taught four- years at Hector, Minnesota.

On June 14, 1930 she was united in marriage to Earl Lovering of Hector, which place has since been her home.

On Jan. 4th she submitted to a major operation at St. And-rews Hospital, Minneapolis, and though the operation was suc-cessful, serious complications

de-veloped which despite heroic efforts on the part of physicians and nurses, and fervent prayers of those near and dear, caused her death on Thursday, Jan. 9, 1936, at 5:15 P. M.

The last of these visits was made during the holiday season just past, the memory of which rests as a benediction upon the loved ones now made desolate by her departure.
